

#### **BOARD OF CHRISTIAN OUTREACH**



St. Luke/St. Paul's Food Kitchen & Pantry

The third Tuesday of every month, the Board of Christian Outreach prepares a meal to bring to St. Luke/St.Paul's Church in Bridgeport. This ongoing mission project is totally dependent on the generosity of members and friends from our church and those from Jesse Lee.

Our monthly menu is chicken legs and thighs, side dishes of potatoes, rice or pasta, prepared any style you choose. Vegetables, salads, fruit and desserts round out the menu. These items are usually donated by members and friends and we try to coordinate with Jesse Lee so your early sign-up is appreciated. Some standard items and condiments are purchased and monetary donations towards their cost are very welcome. We also need help with transportation and serving the dinner at St.Luke/St.Paul's.
