2 Timothy 1:1

What is the mission of the Church? What does it mean to be a Christian? How are we called to live our lives? These are all questions that I have been asking myself throughout life. It should be something we all consider throughout our lifetimes, always reassessing how we live our Christian faith as individuals and communities of faith. Lately, in worship we have been discussing questions of faith and vitality. We have looked at self definitions and how they impact our work. We've looked at all that distracts us in our ability to feel the presence of God. And just this past week, we have looked at how we approach God, our use of prayer. All of this introspection is about assessing where we are as individuals and as a community when we look at faith vitality.

We should be assessing the health of our faith, as we have doctors assess the health of our bodies with yearly check-ups. We need to ask ourselves if we are allowing for the life of Christ to work within us. Are we learning more about his work, are we searching for the presence of the Holy Spirit, and are we looking towards Christ for inspiration and guidance in our work? In his opening lines Paul writes to Timothy, what seems like a generic greet, but it is anything but generic. It is a reminder that all that Paul does and all that we do should be for the sake of the life that is offered to all in Christ Jesus. This month I am focused on that which gives life.

As I prepare for our first Vacation Bible School, I have been reacquainting myself with some old familiar Christian children's music. It is in that music that I am reminded of the life that should be growing inside of us with each passing day. I am reminded of that which gives me purpose, energy, love, and the courage to trust in the will of God and that is the life given to me by Christ. A life given to all of us not because we deserve it, or have been particularly good, but because in his love for humanity it has been extended to all. I am reminded of what grows that life filling my soul with joy so that it spills forth into the work that I do with others. For me what I do to deepen and widen my faith is just as important as what I do for others. I sing, and raise my voice to God. I talk to God so much so that sometimes I wonder if

he gets tired of listening to me. I read my scriptures and study their history learning new depths of the love of the Holy. What inspires your heart to vitality of faith? This August get reacquainted with the practices that connect you with God and deepen your understanding of the Holy in your lives. Remember the words of those childhood songs because they hold very true to each of us at all stages of life. So this month I will leave you with one of my favorite Christian Children's Songs that reminds me that I am in fact never alone in life because of the love of Jesus.



NEWS FROM THE CONNECTICUT CONFERENCE

It has been proposed that the Connecticut conference make some drastic changes to their structure to include in our conference the Massachusetts and Rhode Island conferences. This could take one of two forms: Federating or Merging. Federating would mean that all three of the conferences maintain their own staff but would share support staffing, meetings and trainings. Merging would mean becoming a regional Conference that shares all staff and funding. As they are just starting to reach out in a time of discernment to the churches and their clergy for their feelings, thoughts, and questions, this might be a good time to express concerns and questions which I can then relay back to the board. This would mean there would be changes for the churches locally and at the state level. It may mean an increased in per capita dues to bring CT churches in line with the other two state conferences. It would also mean more resources and opportunities for the churches. Nothing is definite. This is our time to express our opinions before any action is taken. Please speak with Rev.
