On October 25th the church council met to discuss a proposal made by the town to make changes to the pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Center and Westport Roads to accommodate pedestrians going to the Post Office, Greiser's gas station, and Greiser's Coffee and Market. The proposal involved the use of church property and the redirection of our sidewalks. Attached you will see the short letter sent to the Town's Land Use Director and the First Selectman regarding this request for changes to our grounds. The Congregational Church of Easton's Church Council, a group representing the various boards and committees of the Church, met on Sunday, October 25, 2020 to discuss the town's proposal for improvements to the pedestrian patterns at the intersection of Center and Westport Roads (Rt. 136). After a thorough review of the pros and cons of the proposal, the Church Council unanimously voted not to endorse the proposed work as it applies to the Church property.




Holiday Cookie Sale December 12th

What Does Worship Look Like?

Worship in the era of Covid-19 will look very different. These are the recommendations made by the CDC, the State of CT, and the United Church of Christ.

- Unison and Responsive readings and prayers would be done by the pastor with the congregation encouraged to read along silently
- Hymns will be sung by a soloist (likely Rev. Amanda) from the pulpit
- Offering will not be taken in the traditional way but offering plates will be located at the doors for people to drop their donations on the way in or out
- Bulletins will be located in the pews or on the chairs in the fellowship hall
- People will be asked to leave slowly allowing each family to leave one at a time
- Communion will be observed but individually wrapped communion will be picked up on the way out to be taken in each person's car
- Everyone will be required to wear masks at all times
- Coffee hour will be virtual and at a later time in the day on Zoom
- Temperatures will be taken at the door temperatures of 100 degrees or more will be asked to seek medical attention and we will offer up prayers for you
- Prayer requests must be sent into the church office in advance of worship. There will be no sharing from the floor. Or, you may drop prayers into the prayer box by the Old Academy doors.
- Announcements must be made by email to the church in advance of worship. There will be no sharing from the floor.

The CDC believes that in person worship will be risky because of the prolonged period of time so many people are in one room together and the size of the room and distancing doesn't make a huge difference. If you have compromised health please stay home and join us online.

What Do I Need to Do to Join In Person Worship

- Come wearing a mask
- Be willing to have temperature taken at the door
- Hand sanitizer will be offered at the door for use upon entering and leaving
 - Let us know in advance if you plan to join us and with how many people
 - If you are able volunteer to help with needed volunteer positions

Volunteers Needed

- Taking temperatures at the door (thermometer will be provided with gloves)
- A Volunteer to greet people outside on Sunday mornings and explain the Covid-19 Sunday morning procedures.
