#### **Meditations from the Pastor**

"But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened."

Luke 24: 12

Last Easter, I was one week back from maternity leave and as I sit here and reflect on all the changes and challenges we have seen in since last Easter, I am baffled by how life has changed. I remember struggling with the isolation, not going out to restaurants, not seeing friends and family, not signing my kids up for swim classes, and always being in fear of what would happen if the daycare closed again. Now I have learned to go with the flow. Yes sometimes daycare closes down. Yes, we still haven't seen members our family or friends in over a year and we miss them dearly. But we have learned to spend time with people via the internet. We order out instead of going out. We've instituted family movie night to break up the monotony. And now, I can recite *Finding Nemo* from memory.

As much as it seemed like it at the time, life did not end with this pandemic. It just changed and shifted but time marched on. Just like for the disciples, it must have felt like life was ending with the death of Christ on that cross. But in reality, life was really just beginning for them. Things shifted, they changed, some things died but new life as born out of that suffering and death. And the same is happening now. This is what Easter is really all about. It is about endings and new beginnings. It is about both life and death. It is about new realities, new responsibilities, and new opportunities.

Our lives may never return to the way things were before the pandemic. But perhaps they shouldn't. So much has happened both good and bad. Life has been forever changed. It is up to us how we use it. We can be like the disciples. Like Peter and allow for these experiences to leave a lasting imprint and to use it as a reminder for us to live this life more fully into Christ's work and mission; caring for the world. Or we can sit in despair complaining about all that has happened and allow for the changes to embitter us to the world. We can choose either bitterness and fear or we can choose life and love. It is up to us. This Easter I pray we each choose the new life being offered to us in Christ. Yes it is a changed life. Yes it is new and sometimes uncertain. Yes in that new life there is lose and grief. But if we trust in Jesus then we can follow the lead of Peter and believe and walk confidently into the future created for us.

#### Stewardship Campaign

This, however, does not mean that we are meeting our financial needs for 2021. We are still working at a deficit. So any additional donations would be greatly appreciated.

#### What Does In Person Worship Look Like?

Worship in the era of Covid-19 will look very different. These are the recommendations made by the CDC, the State of CT, and the United Church of Christ.

- Unison and Responsive readings and prayers would be done by the pastor with the congregation encouraged to read along silently
- Hymns will be sung by a soloist (likely Rev. Amanda) from the pulpit
- Offering will not be taken in the traditional way but offering plates will be located at the doors for people to drop their donations on the way in or out
- Bulletins will be located in the pews or on the chairs in the fellowship hall
- Communion will be observed but individually wrapped communion will be picked up on the way out to be taken in each person's car
- Everyone will be required to wear masks at all times
- Prayer requests must be sent into the church office in advance of worship. There will be no sharing from the floor.
- Announcements must be made by email to the church in advance of worship. There will be no sharing from the floor.

The CDC believes that in person worship will be risky because of the prolonged period of time so many people are in one room together and the size of the room and distancing doesn't make a huge difference. If you have compromised health please stay home and join us online.

#### What Do I Need to Do to Join In Person Worship

- Come wearing a mask
- Hand sanitizer will be offered at the door for use upon entering and leaving
  - Let us know in advance if you plan to join us and with how many people
