Meditations from the Pastor

In the winter time in New England, our days are shorter, colder, and we are reminded of darkness. But with each day there is *more and more light*. This year let's use this time of darkness and increased time inside our homes as a time to notice the quiet and to reflect upon our lives, our world, and our experiences. 
